Financial Report

Report presented by Treasurer Geoff Lucas. Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet as attached.

\$18,000.12 profit in 2014/15 giving a balance of \$100,985.06 in accounts as of closing date 30th September 2016.

The report is prepared on a cash basis with minor exception of accrual for payments from Queensland and Victorian Laser Associations for their contributions for a joint 3rd party insurance policy.

A healthy profit of the year and balance of funds. Our membership, regatta receipts and interest were up.

Much of this surplus derived from the Nationals at Belmont where the Club charged only direct costs for running the event and we had over budget entries which saw a surplus compared to the event budgeted break even.

General Business

Live tracking/streaming of events - raised by Charlotte Stanfield

- Can we organise on water video feeds and fleet tracking for the interest of spectators and post event for the sailors.
- Comments on the poor service for sailing at the Rio Olympics. Some clubs are using inexpensive mobile based tracking with mixed success.

More publicity of events and happenings – raised by Clare Alexander

- Can we send out more email advice on new posts and happenings.
- As well use Social Media more and possibly email system such as Mailchimp to drive traffic to the web site.
- Agreed to follow up with Clare on ideas and things that have work for Double Bay SC.

Initiatives under consideration for funding

- The Committee have been in discussion on revamping the club level training program in which the Association pays for a coach and the club organises the on water facilities for a day of coaching.
- Around 10 club members can conveniently be catered for by one coach.

Financial support for elite level youth Laser sailors

- The Committee have been considering funding assistance for Laser youth sailors who don't qualify for Sailing Australia assistance travelling to international events.
- Propose to discuss with youth sailors and their parents in this category to determine the best way to provide sustainable assistance.

Association Regattas:

- Dates and venues for 2017/18 season are close to being locked in and will be published when finalised. Clubs setting their schedules can contact Kevin Phillips to check proposed dates of association regattas.
- Clubs wishing to host an association regatta should express their interest to Kevin Phillips as planning looks a few seasons ahead.

Chairman's Report NSW/ACT Laser AGM 19th November 2017

NSW/ACT Lasers have had a successful 2016/17 season.

NSW/ACT District Sailing

In the past year we have run four district regattas which attracted 378 entries in total. This is an increase of 40% over last season.

The State Masters at Great Lakes was our largest regatta with 114 entries. As usual GLSC was a great venue with good breezes though the weed troubled many sailors. The States at Georges River saw the usual very good true breeze and we enjoyed the excellent facilities of the GRSC. The down stairs café was also a hit with the sailors.

We had a really good rollup for our non-cube regattas with 83 travelling to South Lakes in October 2016 for the Coasts and 80 in March to Double Bay for the Metropolitan Championship.

We had good conditions for the majority of races and thanks to our top notch RO's Col Chidgey the events ran very smoothly.

State Champions for 2016/17 were current World Masters Champion Brett Beyer WSC in the Standards, Finn Alexander DBSC in the Radial and Nathan Bryant RPAYC in the 4.7's.

Thanks to the host clubs for putting on a great show for us. Though we pay \$1,000 per event per day to the clubs to cover their running costs. The on the water and in the club house teams make the events work. They do it just for the love of the sport and we thank them one and all.

We are already planning the 2018/19 season venues so if you or your club have an interest or suggestion now is the time to act.

International Sailing

Australia and in particular NSW/ACT Laser Masters Sailors did very well in the World Masters in trying conditions at Split Croatia in October this year.

There were 350 competitors from around the Laser world. We punched above our weight winning three age categories and 8 cubes over all. Congratulations to Ozzie winners Brett Beyer (Master Standard), Martin White (GM Radial) and Kerry Waraker who beat the Laser immortal Peter Seidenberg to win the Legends (75+).

NSW/ACT Membership

Overall our District membership for the year was slightly down at 227. We like to keep our membership numbers healthy not so much for revenue as we pass around half our collected membership fees onto ALCA and ILCA to help to support their activities. The greater the number of Australian Laser sailors we have as members the larger our allocation of places in limited entry international events.

Administration

Hopefully we are keeping sailors informed on sailing, events, results and Laser sailing happenings through laser.asn.au. We try not to barrage members and others on our email list with endless messages. If you have any suggestions about communications or other aspects of administration please feel free to pass them on to me.
