

The following is a great idea for an article for Australian Sailing.

Laser 4.7 INTERCLUB CHALLENGE 30 Nov. Hunters Hill Sailing Club - 2 races (1330 hours start) 7 Dec Woollahra Sailing Club - 2 races (1330 hours start).

This is a new regatta that has been developed to promote the Laser 4.7 Class in NSW &ACT. It has been sponsored by the NSW and ACT Laser Association and is held over 2 days (this Sunday and next Sunday). It comprises 4 races and although an open regatta, will be dominated by youth male and female sailors. It is a great concept because it is directed at improving and sewing the grass roots of the Laser class in Australia and helps promote more girls into sailing. The 4.7 is a much less demanding boat to sail in terms of strength and weight than the Laser and Laser Radial but still has the one design elements of close rac-

ing/same equipment and the demand for sound tactics. The Laser National championships this vear are being held in Geelong where there is expected to be a fleet on about 20 to 30 4.7 Lasers competing. The NSW and ACT Laser Association's real aim is to have 50-70 Laser 4.7's competing at the 2005 Laser National Championships to be held at Belmont on Lake Macquarie at Christmas/New Year next year (the 2005 Laser/ Laser Radial/4.7 national championships at Belmont is shaping up as being one of the biggest in history, maybe 200-300 Lasers - in all divisions). I would love to see this event given some publicity in Australian Sailing primarily because it is promoting local youth sailing and would help the class to grow. I think that the kids would get a huge amount of enjoyment and satisfaction out of seeing their photos in the magazine and the regatta is a new and unique initiative that deserves to be known throughout the sailing community. Tony Mowbray has landed+

KENNARDS HIRE ANTARCTIC EXPEDITION
Tony Mowbray and 4 crew departed
Hobart on December 19 for the
Southern Ocean, Commonwealth Bay
and Mawson's Hut, the Antarctic
home of explorer Sir Douglas Mawson.

Team Mowbray came across their first iceberg on December 30. 'Unbelievable feeling, emotional, exciting, majestic, blue, white, pure

white, sun glistening. Wow, I said WOW!! If we had to turn around now and go home it has already been worth it.'

On New Year's Day they had been hove to with a storm tri-sail only for over 24 hours in a SSE gale with winds constantly between 40 to 50 plus knots. 'It is VERY, VERY cold with big seas, relentless blizzard conditions full of stinging snow and sleet.' Team Mowbray arrived in Commonwealth Bay, Antarctica on January 4. Emerging from a big blow they came across "Iceberg Alley". For as far as you could see 50, 60, 70 or more 'bergs in all shapes, sizes and colours. This report is worth a read at Jan 8 - Kennards Hire Antarctic Expedition—Tony Mowbray and crew visit Mawson's Hut, which is a timber structure over 90

'There is no doubt an aura shrouds the hut and surrounding area where the passionate young men of the Australian Antarctic Expedition lived together so many years ago.' Heading home they came across pack ice! An absolutely impenetrable barrier of the most tightly packed convoluted ice stretching in a crescent shape from west to east as far as the eye could see. Membership...Pay or face the Consequences!

Yes, the famous membership column, 'What's he going to write about this time?' you ask, and I ask the same question. Well, this last few months I've studied how other organizations collect their fees, and it hasn't helped me a bit!

The gas, electricity, water, phone and cable TV companies have it made, you don't pay and they cut off the service. It's so simple, you get up one day wondering why the house is cold, no water, and the phone is dead. This certainly starts to convince people that they should pay the bill, but the clincher comes when you go to the

Never Again! From Nik Skulander

Hev Paul, you can publish this.

I have some concerns regarding the NSW & ACT district Associations decisions over the past year about the locations of regattas. This started when the Association decided to cancel the metro's on Sydney Harbour. This regatta was cancelled at about 8:00pm the Friday night before the regatta. This would have to be one of the most stupid decisions in sailing I have heard of.

The regatta was cancelled because of the bush fires around the F3 and the possibility that it could be closed not letting some sailors through from the central and north coasts. An absolute maximum of 15 sailors would have been disadvantaged. The association did not take into account that about 10 people had travelled from Victoria, international sailors had planned their trip to Australia around the regatta and a lot of Australian sailors were using this regatta as a lead up to the Australian Titles (Olympic Selection). On the Saturday morning the F3 was open and in lieu of the metro's a small, poorly managed regatta was conducted.

The association gave the interstate competitor's free entry to the next metro's in the new year. That regatta was scheduled on the same weekend as the Victorian States??

Next, NSW regattas should not be held at venues further north than Newcastle or south of Wollongong, unless sailors from outside these areas constantly attend regattas. It is just not acceptable to expect 97% of Laser fleet to travel, when a small number of sailors don't bother to travel to the Sydney area. The majority of sailors refuse to travel large distances to race against the same people they race against every weekend.

This is backed up by the poor turn out for the coast championships at Forster.

At the NSW Masters states at Lake Munmorah, Paul Hargan made a request that everybody must join the Association and that we only have 40 something members signed up at the time out of 300. The first regatta of the year is the coasts, this must be in a popular venue to sign as many members as possible.

Also, at the masters states 2003, I was asked to be PRO, I had done this before at Gosford for the masters states in 2002 and agreed. Well, if I had known what I was letting myself in for I would have never agreed. First, this club is run by 2 people only! We had 90 boats! Neither of these people had seen or laid a trapezoid course before! Neither of the boats had radio communication and the mark laying boat, once the course was laid, anchored at the top mark and stayed there all day.

If the wind had come in as forecasted, I would have had no other option but to cancel racing if there was any broken gear or if anybody had got into trouble. Nobody should have given approval for this club to run a Laser regatta. In my opinion there are only 6 clubs with the numbers of people and facilities who can run Laser class regattas:-

Woollarah SC Gosford SC Belmont 16ft SC Manly Skiff Club Lake Illawarra SC Georges River 16ft SC

The Laser Class in NSW is no where near as strong as it was in the early and mid nineties. We must have regattas at clubs that can handle the number ο f boats, and also encourage people to attend regattas by putting regattas in areas which are easy to get to. After all, don't we want as many mempossible in the bers a s association to keep the class strong?

I grew up and lived on the Central Coast and travelled constantly to regatta's from 1993 on. Then, every coast championship was at Bel-Metro was at **RSYS** mont, every and the states were at club's like Manly, Georges river etc. The class was very strong, this was before the class was an Olympic class! We used to have 40-60 radials at every regatta even more big rigs, in 1996 60 boats from NSW travelled to Perth for the Nationals! We get no where near this now!

I'm on the committee of the ALA, and if I hadn't had to spend 8 hours in a car in 1 weekend for 4 hours sailing I would have been at the coasts to put my hand up there also.

Michael Blackburn's Olympic Report

Hello.

Yesterday, thanks to the Sailing Scene of Mona Vale, Sydney, I took delivery of my 12th Laser. Fair enough too since I've been sailing Lasers since 1988!

My first boat was number 70065, a scratched red and cream coloured \$1400 model. I think it was made of wood. I remember quite clearly driving with that hoat from Canherra to Sydney to do some sailing on the Harbour around Christmas time, I decided it might be fun to go out and watch the start of the Sydney-Hobart race and launched at midday on the 26th from Balmoral. I piloted by little Laser into the middle of the spectator fleet around Middle Head I have never since sailed a Laser in such incredible chop – one metre high waves coming from all directions. It was very difficult sailing and staying in one place to watch any of the start was near impossible. A Waterways boat spotted this little sail boat among the mass of power boats and suggested I shouldn't be there - "If vou fall over we won't be picking you up". So I splashed my way back to the beach

A few years later I still liked sailing the Laser very much and saved up to by a new one. So I turned up to Kerli Corlette's shop in Sydney (which would become Sailing Scene) with the aim of taking home a new Laser plus trailer. I had a certain amount of money in my bank account and no more. It was not quite enough but Kerli loves to get people into boats and after a bit of haggling I drove away with a new 'factory second' on a trailer.

In 1993 the Laser was 'selected' for the Olympics and in preparation for the Olympic trials in 1995 I asked Kerli if he would help me upgrade to some new equipment again. I explained that I was a good candidate to represent Australia and he said "Yeah, why not?" And he has supported me ever since and that support is very much appreciated.

Last week, I was in Melbourne for the Go for Gold regatta, which I think is better named the Black Rock Yacht Club Boot Camp. The regatta bears a lot of resemblance to those boot camp experiences you can buy into these days – spending a few days flogging yourself because it seemed like a good idea before you started. The organisers packed 10 races into 3 days and this year we had at least 20 knots for all races with a temp of about 17-18 degrees. So it was quite cold and unusually hard on the legs. I was first, followed by Tom Slingsby.

Next up is another month at home, including the Sydney International Regatta in mid-December. Then it's down to Geelong for the Nationals early in the New Year, followed by Sail Melbourne.

I finished the Sydney International Regatta yesterday in first place. Second was Tom Slingsby from Gosford. I put Tom up front in this report because he reckoned it made him famous when I mentioned him in my last report! Tom's only 19 so it's great to have a young tiger nipping at my heals.

We had 50+ Lasers from more than 10 countries and the regatta was held in vintage Sydney Harbour conditions – shifty like a used car salesman and bumpy like a goose.

During the regatta the organisers were constantly in touch with Sydney Harbour ferry

control and the Port Authority to help decide how and where to run the races amidst the typically busy weekend traffic on the Harbour. One container ship caused a race to be abandoned and another lead to the shortening of a race. However, in a rare thing for the Harbour, barely a Manly Ferry crossed through our course area during racing and thanks must go to Sydney Ferries for that.

On the 2nd January I head down to Geelong for the Nationals where some 200 Lasers will race on Corio Bay. That regatta winds up on the 10th Jan and then it's across to Sandringham for Sail Melbourne which has its first Laser race scheduled for the 13th.

Hello,

I've finished first in the Olympic trials for the Laser class. The Sail Melbourne regatta concluded at Sandringham Yacht Club today and although I've been about on fire as a wet potato I am very pleased to report I've done enough to gain selection for the Australian Olympic Team for Athens.

I finished the regatta 3rd and this was obviously more than enough to make the team considering the 25 point lead I had going into the regatta. But I'm not one to count my chickens before they have a full set of feathers so I double checked every fitting and trod wearily during racing to avoid major mistakes.

Last week I also took out my fifth Australian Laser Championship. It was sailed in Geelong, the other side of Port Phillip Bay to Sandringham. The water was quite flat and the wind very shifty so it was a nice change to come to Sandringham and race in the fresh afternoon sea breezes that can whip up some of the best Laser sailing waves on the planet.

Next up I'll allow myself a little break. Then, I'll have a couple of months of uninterrupted training. That will lead into a regatta I've been looking forward to for a while - the Laser Radial Worlds in Brisbane in April. Of course, I'll be too heavy for the smaller sail of the Radial and if it's light winds I expect to get thrashed by a lot of lightweights.

I'm still putting the finishing touches on my competition program for the remainder of the year but there are two key events - the Laser Worlds (10-19 May) and Olympics (13-28 Aug).

I also look forward to working with a new coach, Arthur Brett. Arthur has done a lot of coaching, sailboarding, sailmaking and won the Contender worlds twice. He is relatively new to full-time coaching and when he was awarded an AIS coaching scholarship last year he probably didn't expect to be helping someone in the Olympic Team... At this stage it is also important that I thank my physio Donna White, sponsors Sailing Scene, Ronstan and Queensport Marine, my mother, brother and Belinda as well as staff at Yachting Australia, NSW Institute of Sport, my former coach Erik and members of Middle Harbour Amateur Sailing Club for helping me reach this point.




The Party
